



The Duke of Edinburgh's Award is a programme of personal development. It is designed to test a candidates' commitment, persistence and initiative. You can start the Award when you have turned 16 years old and have completed the Silver Award.

## The Gold Award

To gain the Gold Award you will need to undertake activities in each of the five sections shown in the table below and demonstrate improvement through persistence and commitment. There should be regular commitment over the time period shown below averaging at least an hour a week for each section. Completion of all five sections of the Award will result in the presentation of a Gold DofE badge and certificate which may be presented to you at an Award Ceremony at Holyrood Palace, Edinburgh.

## The Duke of Edinburgh's Award at Dollar Academy

Dollar Academy has a wealth of co-curricular activities and opportunities that can help a pupil fulfil the requirements of their DofE programme. Activities and opportunities that take place out of school can also be used. DofE candidates are responsible for setting up and organising their own placements in the Volunteering, Skills, Physical Recreation and Residential sections. The Academy will organise and set up the Expedition section for all candidates who wish to use walking as their chosen mode of transport. Expedition training will take place this session in early June somewhere in the Highlands, followed by expedition assessment in NW Scotland later in June (estimated cost for both expeditions is expected to be around £180).
